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## THE CHARACTER OF THE SERVANT SIGNALS SUCCESS PLANNED (ISAIAH 49:1-13).

This passage is a clear prophecy of how the Lord God planned for mankind's deliverance from sin. The great deliverance was planned to come through the work of one specific Person - the Messiah. True deliverance was carefully crafted so that freedom from sin could be offered to whosoever chose to accept that deliverance.

A careful examination of these verses (49:1-13) highlights the marvelous scheme of Redemption that Christians enjoy. A careful study of these points will help Christians to appreciate the love and mercy of God as the heavenly Father planned salvation because of the divine love. Look closely at these verses and come to appreciate further God's great love that succeeded in providing a scheme of redemption.
